There are six week-long art camps to choose from, with each week a new adventure in arts and nature. The creative freedom and boundless joy of Bernard Langlais' spirit inspires us to think outside the box, and to let our imaginations flourish!

June 24-28 - BUTTERFLY GARDEN...Plant a garden with native Maine flowers to attract butterflies, insects and caterpillars! Explore curiosity about life cycles, native plants, and the importance of the insect world, while creating colorful works of art with LEAPS OF IMAGINATION artist Susan Beebe.

July 8-12 - MAINE ANIMALS...Explore the wild wonder of Maine animals through tracks, outdoor adventure, literature and Langlais' imaginative art. Create a collaborative animal bas relief mural with LEAPS OF IMAGINATION artist Susan Beebe.

July 15-19 - PUPPETS COME ALIVE ...Enjoy a week of imaginative fun in creating lively puppets inspired by the outdoor preserve. The week will include a puppet show created and scripted by campers for families to come and enjoy on Friday! Led by teaching artist Felicia Cinquegrana.

July 22-26 - WINGED WONDERS...Looking up to discover the birds and butterflies that dance in the sky, we will experiment with design, fabrics, and color, finding connections between science and art. We'll create wonderful artistic movement in works of art that honor flying creatures. Led by teaching artist Nina Devenney

July 29-Aug 2 – IMAGINE: SCULPTURE...Throughout this week of immersion in Bernard Langlais' sculptures, campers will create 3-D art with natural materials, whimsical ideas, and inspiration from the art and landscape at the Sculpture Preserve. Led by teaching artist Felicia Cinquegrana.

August 5-9 - THE BIG PICTURE: EARTH...A week of adventurous creativity in better understanding our role as stewards of our planet. We'll explore the changing landscape of the Earth, and create works of art from discarded plastic to illustrate the power of art and the importance of children's voices. Led by teaching artist Nina Devenney.
